Find a quiet spot, close your eyes and listen to the sounds of the sea ☐

Walk along the St Kilda foreshore and spot the boats out at sea ☐

Identify a small shorebird ☐

Look for animal tracks and traces in the sand ☐



Identify which bird has the most colours ☐

Find out about the East Asian - Australasian Flyway and the migratory birds ☐

Use your binoculars or camera to zoom in on the different beaks the shorebirds may have. ☐

Visit the interpretive sign at St Kilda and pick a shorebird to investigate ☐

Watch closely the shorebirds feeding in the mudflats ☐

Explore the Southern shorebird walking trail at Thompson Beach ☐

Count your steps from the seagrass to the water at Thompson Beach ☐

Go Dolphin spotting at the Port River ☐

Build a sand castle and decorate with discarded shells ☐

Enjoy jumping the small tidal waves as they come to the shoreline ☐
