Welcome



Hello all, and welcome to Issue 23 September 2016, of the 'Out and About in VK5' newsletter which focuses on VK5 activities relating to Summits on the Air (SOTA), Parks (including WWFF and the VK5 National & Conservation Parks Award), portable operation, QRP, pedestrian mobile, mobile, etc.

Well after my plea for articles last month, I did receive a positive response, which was very pleasing to see. Now to see if that continues. Many thanks to Col VK5HCF, Ian VK5CZ, Andy VK5AKH, Grant VK5GR, Les VK5KLV, Rob VK4FFAB, and Peter VK3YE, who all contributed articles for inclusion in this issue of Out and About. Remember that the survival of this newsletter is entirely up to you. Any contributions are welcome. You might think that your article it isn't worth sending in. Let the readers be the judge of that.

We are now starting to come into the warmer weather and SOTA & Parks activators are starting to venture out a bit more often. Despite the days of sunshine however, we did have a very wet and wild August in South Australia at times. Often 4 seasons in a handful of days.

Les VK5KLV sent me some photos taken recently at Mount Arden in the Mid North of the State, which shows that with the warmer weather, the snakes are now on the move. In the next issue I will include an article on snake bite. Fortunately I have only encountered a few snakes during all of my activations.

During August I added a further 81 South Australian parks to the World Wide Flora Fauna program. They include Recreation Parks, Marine Parks, Wilderness Protection Areas, and Game Reserves. There is now definitely no excuse for not finding a park to activate from.

I have started planning a SOTA & Parks symposium, similar to what was held a few years ago. It will include presentations from a number of experts in the field, a linked dipole construction session, and some portable sessions out in the field. I'll keep you all updated as this progresses. If the last symposium is any indication, this event should prove to be extremely popular. It will be a great way of honing your skills, or perhaps giving you enough confidence to try your very first SOTA or Park activation.

The International Lighthouse and Lightship Weekend (ILLW) took place again in August, with lighthouses being activated all around the world. Together with 4 other amateurs from the Adelaide Hills Amateur Radio Society (AHARS), I headed over to Kangaroo Island. There we operated from the Cape Willoughby lighthouse, which is located within the Cape Willoughby Conservation Park. I would welcome any articles from other VK5's who activated from a lighthouse over the 2016 ILLW.

Whilst on Kangaroo Island I activated a further 10 Conservation Parks, a number of which had never previously been activated. You can read about that trip in this issue.

A reminder that thanks to a number of enthusiastic amateurs, the VK Shires program has been 'relaunched'. A net takes place on 20m and 40m each Friday and the award is being reviewed. Allen VK3ARH has even integrated VK Shires into the already brilliant

parksnpeaks program. You can read more about the VK Shires program in this issue of Out and About.

Also a reminder that later in the year we have the VKFF Team Championship (on 16th October); the 6th annual Keith Roget Memorial National Parks Award Activation Weekend (11th-14th November); and then the VKFF Activation Weekend (26th and 27th November). So there arte plenty of opportunities coming up to get out into the field.


Just a reminder to keep 7.125 clear if at all possible. That frequency is set aside for AM operation. A number of months ago I received a complaint from an AM op regarding Park & SOTA activators using that frequency.

I was contacted AGAIN recently by the same amateur who has complained previously regarding 7.125. He again complained that over the weekend of 6th/7th August there was a park activator on 7.125. As it turned out this was NOT a VK5 park activator, but actually a VK3 SOTA activator.

I know it very rarely occurs, but if at all possible, please keep that frequency clear to avoid any potential issues.

A submission has recently been submitted for that frequency to be included in the bandplan.

These proposed notifications are just that... *proposed*. You can change your agenda at any time. (I have already done that twice!)

Freeze your Butt Off



The time has come to publish the results for the Down Under FYBO for 2016

The contest was trialled and run on 26th of June this year which seemed to be ideal weather for the contest with snow in some states and lots of rain in South Australia this winter.

We had entries for 2 of the 3 categories set aside for the contest and with out re writing the rules here no one entered a log for the portable section only logs for the FYBO and Home Station were submitted. Some FYBO operators took part in the contest in Parks and others on Summits I also received a log from a Station set up on the Beach and others just out in Bush land, a good selection of "walk in" type activity.

There was some confusion about the importance of the hourly repeat contact for some as the multiplier but I was able to check the logs and adjust scores accordingly.

So the winner for the Home section was Nev VK5WG who made 14 Qso's during the full time of the contest and because he maintained that hourly repeat exchange 12 times he was able to collect 12 multiplier point which boosted his score to 3768 points being the top score for the Home station section.



Top Score for the FYBO section was Paul VK5PAS who made 151 Qso's during the full time of the contest and maintained the hourly repeat exchange 50 times to use as his multiplier to give him a score of 22,550 points.



During my time in the contest I worked 8 SOTA peaks as a chaser, 4 Parks as a chaser, 1 operator on the beach 12 different home stations and 1 dx station from Europe.

Congratulations to the highest scorers and thanks everyone for taking part, thanks to those who submitted a log.

Black Bullock Hill is a little one pointer located on the Fleurieu Peninsula.

Marija qualified the summit, making a total of 9 contacts, which included 8 Summit to Summit contacts (19 S2S points).

I made a total of 64 contacts, including 35 S2S contacts (113 S2S points).

There was a large amount of SOTA activity on the bands due to this terrific little event, put together by the VK1 SOTA crew including Andrew VK1AD.

If you do intend to activate a park that weekend, PLEASE drop me a quick email with







Wiring a footswitch for use with computer type headset on the KX3

This is a really simple little project. All that is required is:

- 1. a headset.
- 2. The Elecraft KX3 Packet cable accessory set. (You only need the ACC2 module)
- 3. A suitable foot switch.

On the cable from the footswitch you will need a MONO 3.5mm plug.

This goes into the socket on the ACC2 module, (alongside the RCA socket).

The 2.5mm stereo plug on the other end of the module plugs into, (you guessed it) the ACCES2 socket on the KX3.

The headset speaker stereo plug goes into the "PHONES" socket on the KX3 and the stereo plug from the headset microphone plugs into the "MIC" socket on the KX3.

All that remains to complete the installation is to press and hold the "MENU" button on the KX3 and change the following two items. MENU ITEM: ACC2 IO......

Change value from "OFF" to "Lo=Ptt" and MIC BTN......Change value to "OFF" That's it.

If your standard Elecraft mic has ptt and up / down buttons you will need to changes the MIC BTN menu back to "Ptt" after you have finished using the headset and the ACC2 IO menu will need to be returned to the "OFF" state. Also the latest revision to the KX3 software has the voice recorder module activated so that you

now have 2 15 second voice message slots available for "CQ" calls or whatever.

Almost 4 years in SOTA

Its been almost 4 years now since SOTA started in vk5 so it was time to go back to my first summit this year for the annual activation. I walked in this time from a neighbouring vineyard on the northern side of the summit property and it was only about 2 km to hike in. The country is very wet now after lots of rain and even over 500 metre above sea level there were a couple of boggy soaks I had to pass through in the paddocks.



Very pretty country side and the weather was nice and cool for hiking.

Right at the top now near the trig point and GRN comms tower so I set up slightly north of the trig near an old fallen tree that is good for mounting my squidy.



This is a shot of the clip on extension I am using to get my 20/40 link dipole to work on 80m I have around 9.6 m of extra wire to clip onto both ends of the dipole once it is erect. The clip on wires are then run out further to make a 80m dipole. So far it has worked very well for contacts around vk5 if I am activating in the morning. I usually operate on 3.680 ssb first then cw on the same frequency. Today no one came back on cw but I did make a qso on ssb with Nev VK5WG and Ian VK5IS. Then onto 40m cw thinking I could qualify before roll over then hand out some more chaser points after. I

had 3 in my log with only a few minutes to spare and VK2IO called me but the qsb was so bad I could not get a responding report from him and the clock ticked over and I was into the next UTC day so I had to start all over again.

Thankfully some of the chasers were aware of my plight and came back to chase again after roll over and this time Gerard could hear me better to make a good qso after all. Peter VK3PF and Ron VK3AFW were the only other qso's I had made so I went to 20m hoping ZL1BYD might still be on his summit but I could not hear him there and lucky for me VK6NU and VK6RZ gave me a call to put me over the required amount of qso's. Even though I had Nev and Ian in my log they could not be counted for the new day activation but the VK6's saved my ass.

After I relaxed a bit and just for fun I tried 15m cw just in case my JA friend could hear me as he sent a message to say he was listening on his mobile whip but later txt again to say he could not hear me. Much to my surprise NQ7R answered my cq on 15m along with JS1IFK who must use a Yagi antenna because he is always strong if he calls.

It was a busy activation but it is in the bag now until next year so i packed up and headed off the hill then drove to Laura to meet up with VK5IS VK5MA VK5NWE VK5MBD for lunch which was a nice catch up and first time meeting with VK5MA . We told war stories of course and had a nice lunch at the pub .

A copy of your log must accompany your application and be posted to VK SHIRES AWARDS COMMITTEE, C/- Bill Horner, 11 South St, Wondai, Qld 4606, Australia emailed or to spiritdreaming11@bigpond.com Cost per certificate will be \$5usd for overseas or \$5aud for all VKs.

Basic award VK: 75 shires (must include a minimum of 1 shire from each state) Silver award VK: 150 shires Gold award VK: 300 shires Platinum award VK: all shires

Nomad award:

Basic 25 Shires, Silver 50 Shires, Gold 75 Shires and Platinum 100 Shires. This is a special award for those who travel about and activate shires. Please note you need to work a minimum of 5 stations from each shire.

gold all shires VK8 award: basic 5 shires, silver 10 shires, gold all shires **Please note that all VK9 and VK0 call areas do not count for this award.

***For those who actually go and activate a shire you must work a minimum of 50 stations to be eligible to claim the shire for yourself for all parts of the award except the Nomad Award as above. A copy of your log must be sent to the awards manager for verification.

**** Endorsements for SSB or CW or specific bands or QRP etc are available.

***** All National Parks, State Forests, SOTA etc within the boundaries of a shire shall count for that very shire.

My ideas on setting up your squid pole & portable antenna

By Les VK5KLV

As you would all be aware locating the base of your squid pole is critical to keeping your portable antenna in the air during a park activation. I have used a number of methods and offer a few ideas for your consideration.

1/ Probably the simplest method is to strap the pole to a convenient fence post or similar. I like to use double sided "velcro" strapping in this method, see photos 1 & 2.





2/ Where you don't have a convenient post you can drive in a "star dropper" or similar post into the ground and use the "velcro" strap in the same way as the fence or sign post.



3/ My favourite method involves using a "quadpod" made from the base section of a cheap collapsible aluminium clothes line. I purchased mine from the local "Cheap as Chips" store for \$25.00. See photo 3 for assembled unit in its intended form. Photo 4 shows the "quadpod" which simply uses the base section of the line fitted to the squidpole after removing the original centre section of the clothesline.





The latest portable clotheslines I have seen in "Cheap as Chips" use 3 arms on the top line as well as on the base & require slightly less work to adapt to our use, on the down side, the price has risen considerably.

4/ Finally, once the squid pole is extended it will be necessary to anchor the ends of the antenna & the guying line. I currently use 3 litre milk bottles filled with water as shown in photo 5



5/ The final photo (6) shows the station on air when I spoke to Paul, VK5PAS, Paul, VK5MAP & Craig VK3WAR from the park opposite my home.



3576-3581 (80m JT65/JT9 World Wide DX channel)

7076-7081 (40m JT65/JT9 World Wide DX channel)

7040-7060 (40m VK & WW Digital Modes segment)

Now while some of the voice signals I hear in here are clearly "illegals" there are enough legitimate signals to make you wince.

So, please, think twice about that frequency selection - you might just be killing someone's Greyline DX.....




