### Welcome



Hello to all readers, and a warm welcome to Issue 38 (December 2017) of 'Out and About in VK5'. The 'Out and About in VK5' newsletter is all about promoting Summits on the Air (SOTA), Parks (including WWFF and the VK5 National & Conservation Parks Award), portable operation, QRP, pedestrian mobile, mobile, etc in South Australia.

The month of November was a very busy month for park activators across Australia. The always popular, Keith Roget Memorial National Parks Award (KRMNPA) Activation Weekend (now that is a mouthful), was held between 10<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> November this year. The KRMNPA is well supported by many VK5's, not only as park hunters, but by many VK5's who often venture over the border to conduct Victorian National Park Award activations. This year David, VK3TUN activated the Terrick-Terrick National

Park and also the Heathcote-Graytown National Park, making a number of contacts. Marija VK5FMAZ and I also headed over to Victoria, and activated 4 Victorian National Parks: Lind, Alfred, Coopracambra, and Croajingolong. We made around 390 contacts from these 4 parks. Many thanks to Tony VK3XV, the KRMNPA Manager, for organising another fantastic KRMNPA weekend. Tony has provided a summary report of the weekend in this issue.

And a few weeks later, the 2017 VKFF Activation Weekend was held. This weekend is held each November and is all about promoting the World Wide Flora and Fauna (WWFF) program here in Australia. I have provided a brief rundown of the weekend in this issue. A total of eight (8) VK5 stations took part: Alan VK5AR, Adrian VK5FAJH. Marija VK5FMAZ, Norm VK5GI, Greg VK5GJ, Gordon VK5GY,

Les VK5KLV and myself VK5PAS. Once all of the logs have been submitted, I will do a final tally on QSOs, number of parks activated, etc. I will also forward out participation certificates to all those who took part as activators.

Marija and I didn't spend a huge amount of time at home in November, as we were away in Victoria (VK3) and New South Wales (VK2) for a little over 2 weeks on holidays, to coincide with the KRMNPA Weekend. Marija and I activated a total of 27 parks and 6 SOTA summits whilst we were away and we made around 1,700 contacts. And of course we were away for the weekend in the Riverland region of VK5, for the 2017 VKFFF Activation Weekend. As a result, this issue of Out and About, and the last, are a little late.

And now for the sad news. I am saddened to report that the next issue of 'Out and About in VK5', Issue 39, will be the last. I am winding back my involvement in a number of areas of the hobby, and I have decided that producing this newsletter will be one of those. This is despite the fact that I know there are a lot of readers. Sadly I get very little in the way of contributions to the newsletter from VK5's, other than a handful of regular contributors. 

## KRMNPA rundown

The Seventh KRMNPA activation period was held across 4 days. Friday November 10 to Monday November 13 2017.

The aim of the activation period was to stimulate Portable Amateur Radio "activity" in as many of the 45 VK3 National Parks as possible, to assist both Hunters and Activators to gain "credits' in order to progress their points tally towards achieving their Award program goals....... And, of course, to also have fun in the Great Outdoors.

In 2017 a total of 39 VK3 National Parks were activated across the 4 day period by 21 (possibly 22) Operators. This Data is extrapolated from Parks and Peaks "Spots" and contacts with other activators. The number of Parks activated was a slight decrease from the

previous record of 41 Parks (2016), as indeed was the number of park activators dropping by 4 Ops this year.

As a brief comparison: 2011: 11 Parks / 2012: 15 Parks / 2013: 26 Parks / 2014: 34 Parks / 2015: 28 Parks / 2016: 41 Parks/ 2017: 39 Parks

Again in 2017 the weekend attracted several much welcomed and appreciated Portable Activators from VK2 (John VK2AWJ) and VK5 (Marija VK5FMAZ & Paul VK5PAS). I also noted that Simon VK3/G7WKX was spotted in the Alpine National Park whilst undertaking a SOTA activation. A **BIG** thank you to you all! Your efforts contributed to the activation of many VK3 National Parks which would otherwise not have been available to Hunters.

The Interstate visitor breakdown was as follows:

VK2AWJ/ 3, John, has been a regular Activator participant since 2011, and all look forward to chatting with John as he travels in his trusty Campervan visiting VK3 National Parks. John activated 6 Parks across the 4 day activation period and also added several more pre and post the 4 days, as he works towards the Merit Award. Only a few to go John!

Paul, VK5PAS/3 and Marija VK5FMAZ/3 again made the journey from the Adelaide Hills, taking two weeks to activate 27 Parks (WWFF included) and 6 SOTA activations in a major Parkpedition. Great effort Guys! Thanks Paul and Marija. See you again in 2018 I believe.!

The remaining Parks were activated by an equally keen group of VK3 Amateurs:

**Chris, VK3FHCT** joined Mick for his first Portable activation....... Thanks Chris. I hope it was an enjoyable experience! You have a good mentor.

Rex VK3OF/P and Greg VK3BRQ/P activated Barmah and Lower Goulburn National Parks. This year Rex and Greg managed to avoid any storm activity that made their 2017 activations difficult. Thanks Guys!

**Hiro, VK3EHG/P**, was putting out a great signal from the Organ Pipes National Park, both on CW and SSB once again in 2017. Thanks Hiro. Great to have you on board again.

Amateur Radio Victoria (ARV) will again be providing a 2017 Participants Certificate to all Activators. These will be designed afresh early in 2018 and posted when possible.

In closing, I note that many 2017 Activators have already reached **Merit Award** and in some cases the **Grand Slam Award** level but continue to support the Activation weekend by getting out and about in the VK3 National Parks. This dedication in assisting others to gain points and also get new Ops on the Air is duly noted and **most** appreciated! Thanks Guys and Girls!



But VKFF Hunter, VKFF Hunter Honour Roll, VKFF Activator, Murray River, will now come from the reps.



If you are ever keen to see where all that banging and crashing is coming from, here is an excellent website. It is the South Australian Radar and lightning page on Weatherzone.






