

Telford Scrub Conservation Park

Offering a bird's eye view of the forest from a 4.2-metre high boardwalk, this 175-hectare park contains 11 species of plants considered to be of conservation value. It is ideal for bushwalking, birdwatching and quiet contemplation.

How to get to the park

The park is located 14 kilometres north of Mount Gambier, on the Riddoch Highway. Entry is free.

Facilities

Two picnic tables are nestled in a small clearing, providing an ideal spot for a quiet lunch. Interpretive signs provide information on the park.

Bushwalking

A 100-metre long and 4.2-metre high boardwalk provides visitors with a unique bird's eye view of the forest. The boardwalk is placed in amongst the branches of the trees, enabling visitors to catch a glimpse of the many birds that live there.

A choice of two trails offer one or 2.5-hour walks through the forest, with interpretive signs explaining some of the features along the way.

Plants

Some of the most beautiful plants in the forest are the native orchids. Over 20 species have been found in the park, including pink fingers, common donkey orchid, tiger orchid, and purple cockatoo.

Animals

Several koalas were reintroduced to the park in 1997 from Kangaroo Island. The vulnerable southern brown bandicoot and the endangered sugar glider can also be found.

The National Parks Code

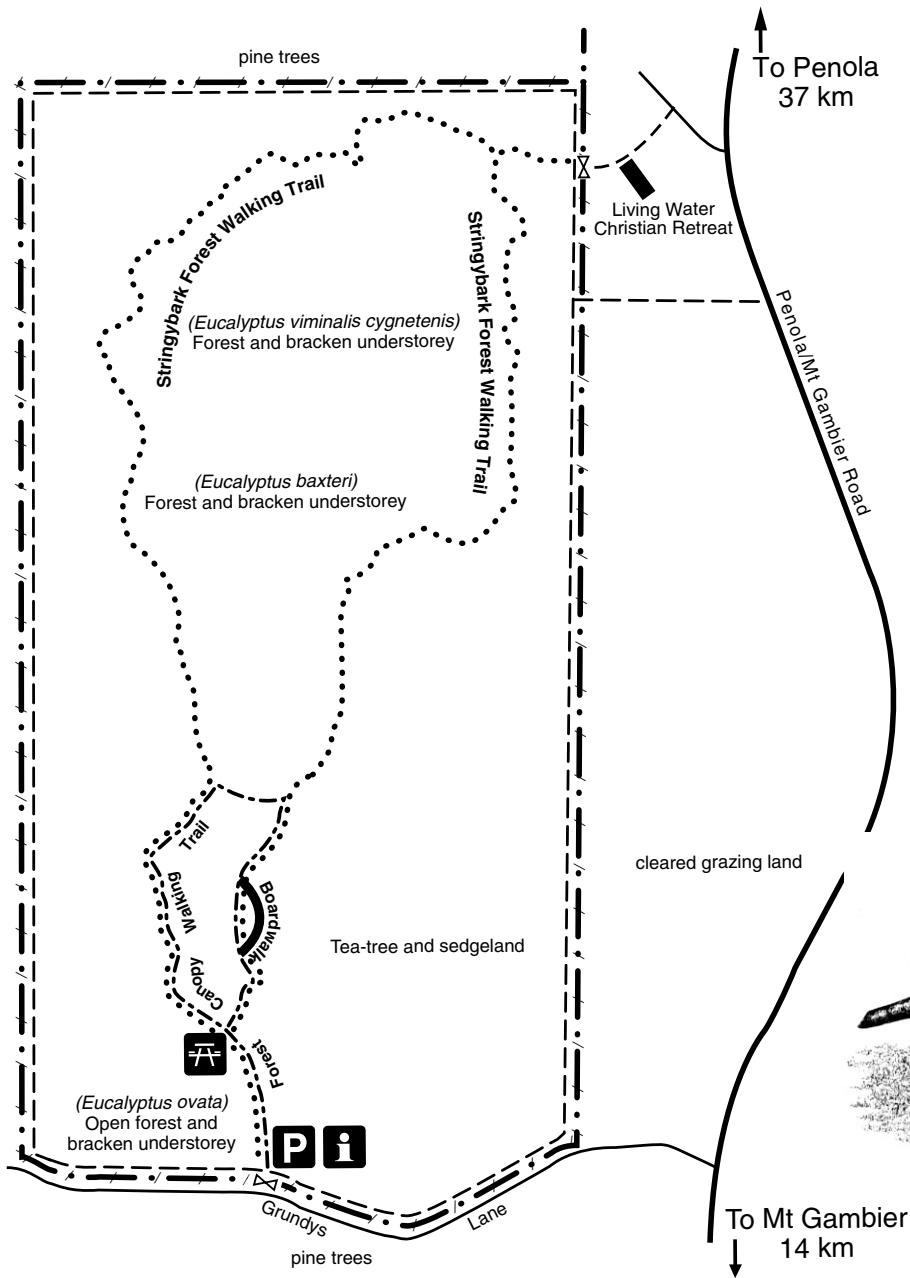
Help protect your national parks by following these guidelines:

- Leave your pets at home.
- Take your rubbish with you.
- Observe fire restrictions, usually 1 November to 30 April. Check CFS hotline 1300 362 361.
- Conserve native habitat by using liquid fuel or gas stoves.
- Respect geological, cultural and heritage sites.
- Keep our wildlife wild. Do not feed or disturb animals, or remove native plants.
- Keep to defined vehicle tracks and walking trails.
- Be considerate of other park users.
- Firearms and hunting are prohibited.
- Camping is not permitted in the park.

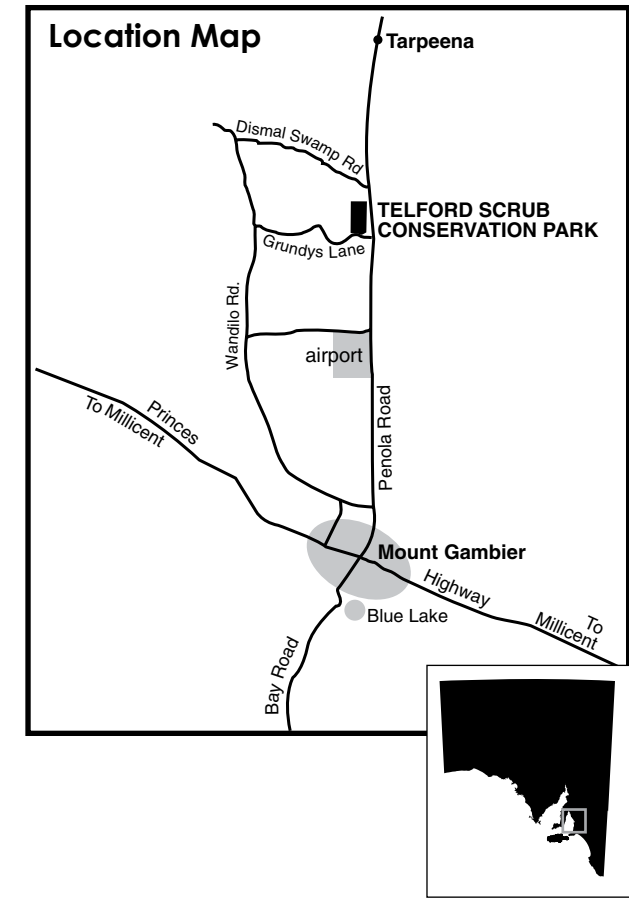
